## Spelling list: o-e words - set 1

A split digraph is a spelling pattern where two letters, typically a vowel and an "e," work together to create a single sound in a word, even though they are separated by another letter. In this list, split diagraph o-e is used to spell the long /o/sound. By adding the $e$, you make the $o$ say its name.

Here are some examples of how adding an e turns a short /o/ sound into a long / $/$ / sound:
$\operatorname{Cod}+e=$ code

Hop $+e=$ hope

Robe $+e=$ robe
