

Spelling list: Days of the week

In Roman times, the days of the week were named after the sun, the moon, Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, and Saturn.

Later, the Germanic peoples adjusted the names of the days so that they reflected their own mythology rather than that of the Romans. As English is part of the West Germanic family of languages, the English words for the days (mostly) derive from these Germanic names.

In this word list, you will learn how to spell each day of the week and also the words we use for different time periods in relation to today. As these are common words, it's important that you become a confident speller of them. Why not keep to the time theme and try out our *Against the Clock* spelling game?

Monday I love going to back to work each **Monday** .

Tuesday I'll meet you on **Tuesday** afternoon.

Wednesday He was sixty years old on **Wednesday** .

Thursday The shops are open late on **Thursday** .

Friday I'll shop for food on **Friday** .

Saturday Jack goes to the pub every **Saturday** .

Sunday **Sunday** is the day of rest.

today You're my first visitor **today** .

tomorrow I'll call you again **tomorrow** .

yesterday The sea was much rougher **yesterday** .

fortnight We will do swimming lessons for one **fortnight** .
