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| practice | Ballet dancers do hours of practice each day. |
| practise | You need to practise playing the violin to get better at it. |
| quiet | If the baby is asleep there is peace and quiet . |
| quite | He's quite good-looking. |
| sights | When I visited my Aunt in Paris, she offered to show me the sights . |
| sites | They filmed at various sites . |
| sauce | Grate some cheese to go in the sauce . |
| source | The source of this river is in those hills. |
| threw | They threw the ball back and forth. |
| through | He kicked the ball through the window. |
| to | That child is getting up to mischief again. |
| too | We ate far too much last night. |
| two | You can have either of these two cakes. |
