Danvers	Sir Danvers Carew is well-liked old nobleman.
Poole	Richard Poole is Jekyll's butler.
Gabriel	Gabriel John Utterson is the narrator of the book.
Carew	Sir Danvers Carew is a member of Parliament, and a client of Utterson.
Guest	Mr. Guest is Utterson's clerk and confidant.
