

Spelling list: Some *ch* words

The most common way to spell the /ch/ sound in English is with the letters *ch* . In this list, you'll find examples that follow this pattern like *chain* and *chicken* . These words help us see how *ch* can create the /ch/ sound in various contexts. As you explore each example, think about how the words fit into sentences and how they can be used in everyday conversations.

chain	There was a broken link in the chain .
charm	I bought a charm for my charm bracelet.
chat	Do you have time for a quick chat ?
cheese	The cheese was very crumbly.
cherry	Each cake was topped with a cherry .
chess	The boy was unbeaten in chess .
chicken	They had chicken for lunch.
children	The children sat in rows.
chop	Could you chop some wood for the fire?
choose	We need to choose a new leader.
church	It was very quiet in the church .
bench	They sat together on the park bench .
bunch	He bought me a huge bunch of flowers.
coach	They went by coach to the beach.
lunch	He had some pasta for lunch .
march	March is the third month of the year.
speech	This is the first draft of my speech .
teacher	The teacher gave me good advice.
