| wild | I heard the roar of a wild animal. |
| climb | They set out to climb Mount Everest. |
| most | Most chairs and tables are made of wood. |
| only | The sweets only cost a few pennies. |
| both | The sea and sky were both deep blue. |
| cold | David has a bad cold and a cough. |
| gold | The king wears a gold crown. |
| hold | Hold the reins lightly. |
| told | I told you to be quiet. |
