debate	Politicians often <b>debate</b> policies live on TV.
argument	He was the aggressor in the <b>argument</b> .
proposition	I will listen to your <b>proposition</b> .

timekeeper	The <b>timekeeper</b> is the peson who keeps track of the time.
adjudicator	The <b>adjudicator</b> judges the competition and decides who has won.
