

## Spelling list: Irregular Verbs: Past Simple Form (c, d and e words)

Irregular verbs in English, beginning with the letters c, d and e. Learn the verbs in their past simple form in column one. See the verbs used in context in column two.

caught	Last winter, I <b>caught</b> a cold. (catch - <b>caught</b> - caught)
chose	I <b>chose</b> to act in last year's play. (choose - <b>chose</b> - chosen)
came	Last Sport's Day, we <b>came</b> first in two races. (come - <b>came</b> - come)
cost	The groceries <b>cost</b> less last week than they did this week. (cost - <b>cost</b> - cost)
cut	Last night, I <b>cut</b> myself while shaving. (cut - <b>cut</b> - cut)
dealt	In the last lesson of the day, I <b>dealt</b> the cards for the matching game. (deal - <b>dealt</b> - dealt)
dug	Last week, at the beach, I <b>dug</b> a hole in the sand. (dig - <b>dug</b> - dug)
did	We <b>did</b> our homework yesterday. (do - <b>did</b> - done)
drew	We <b>drew</b> birds in Art last week. (draw - <b>drew</b> - drawn)
dreamt	Last night, I <b>dreamt</b> I was flying. (dream - <b>dreamt</b> - dreamt)
drank	We <b>drank</b> champagne at last year's party. (drink - <b>drank</b> - drunk)
drove	Last year, I <b>drove</b> to work every day. (drive - <b>drove</b> - driven)
ate	Yesterday morning, we <b>ate</b> eggs for breakfast. (eat - <b>ate</b> - eaten)
