

## Spelling list: Irregular Verbs: Past Simple Form (k, l, and m words)

Irregular verbs in English, beginning with the letters k, l, and m. Learn the verbs in their past simple form in column one. See the verbs used in context in column two.

kept	My sister <b>kept</b> my secret last year. (keep - <b>kept</b> - kept)
knew	We <b>knew</b> all the answers in yesterday's test. (know - <b>knew</b> - known)
laid	Yesterday, I <b>laid</b> the table for supper. (lay - <b>laid</b> - laid)
led	On our last school trip, the teacher <b>led</b> the class through a maze. (lead - <b>led</b> - led)
learnt	We <b>learnt</b> about fractions in Maths last week. (learn - <b>learnt</b> - learnt)
left	We <b>left</b> the party late last night. (leave - <b>left</b> - left)
lent	The library <b>lent</b> us lots of books last year. (lend - <b>lent</b> - lent)
let	Last week, the teacher <b>let</b> the children have extra playtime. (let - <b>let</b> - let)
lay	Last night, she <b>lay</b> down and instantly fell asleep. (lie - <b>lay</b> - lain)
lit	We <b>lit</b> the lamps at 7 o'clock last night. (light - <b>lit</b> - lit)
lost	Last summer, I <b>lost</b> my favourite toy at the beach. (lose - <b>lost</b> - lost)
made	We <b>made</b> sandwiches for lunch yesterday. (make - <b>made</b> - made)
meant	I <b>meant</b> what I said last night. (mean - <b>meant</b> - meant)
met	We <b>met</b> our new teacher yesterday. (meet - <b>met</b> - met)
