

## Spelling list: Irregular Verbs: Past Simple Form (s words - part 2)

Irregular verbs in English, beginning with the letter s. Learn the verbs in their past simple form in column one. See the verbs used in context in column two.

spoke	We <b>spoke</b> to our friend last week. (speak - <b>spoke</b> - spoken)
spelt	I <b>spelt</b> a word wrong in last week's test. (spell - <b>spelt</b> - spelt)
spent	We <b>spent</b> a lot of time outside last summer. (spend - <b>spent</b> - spent)
spilt	Last week, I <b>spilt</b> juice on my clothes. (spill - <b>spilt</b> - spilt)
spoilt	Last year, the rain <b>spoilt</b> our garden party. (spoil - <b>spoilt</b> - spoilt)
spread	Yesterday morning, I <b>spread</b> marmalade on my bread. (spread - <b>spread</b> - spread)
sprang	The teacher <b>sprang</b> a test on us yesterday. (spring - <b>sprang</b> - sprung)
stuck	He <b>stuck</b> up the poster last night. (stick - <b>stuck</b> - stuck)
stood	Yesterday, I <b>stood</b> in line for hours. (stand - <b>stood</b> - stood)
stole	Someone <b>stole</b> our car last week. (steal - <b>stole</b> - stolen)
stung	Earlier this year, a bee <b>stung</b> me on my nose. (sting - <b>stung</b> - stung)
stank	The cheese from yesterday's lunch <b>stank</b> ! (stink - <b>stank</b> - stunk)
struck	Last night, lightning <b>struck</b> the tree in our garden. (strike - <b>struck</b> - struck)
swept	I <b>swept</b> the kitchen floor after dinner yesterday. (sweep - <b>swept</b> - swept)
swam	Last summer, we <b>swam</b> in the sea every day. (swim - <b>swam</b> - swum)
swung	Last year, the monkeys <b>swung</b> through the trees. (swing - <b>swung</b> - swung)
