

## Spelling list: Irregular Verbs: Past Participle Form (c, d and e words)

Irregular verbs in English, beginning with the letters c, d and e. Learn the verbs in their past participle form in column one. See the verbs used in context in column two.

caught	I have <b>caught</b> three colds so far this year. (catch - caught - <b>caught</b> )
chosen	I have already <b>chosen</b> to act in the play. (choose - chose - <b>chosen</b> )
come	I have never <b>come</b> first in a race. (come - came - <b>come</b> )
cost	The groceries have already <b>cost</b> us more this week than they did last week. (cost - cost - <b>cost</b> )
cut	I have <b>cut</b> myself while shaving. ( <b>cut</b> - <b>cut</b> - <b>cut</b> )
dealt	Since you've been in this class, have you <b>dealt</b> the cards for the matching game? (deal - dealt - <b>dealt</b> )
dug	I have just <b>dug</b> a hole in the sand at the beach. (dig - dug - <b>dug</b> )
done	We have just <b>done</b> our homework. (do - did - <b>done</b> )
drawn	I have <b>drawn</b> three birds so far. (draw - drew - <b>drawn</b> )
dreamt	I have <b>dreamt</b> about flying for three nights in a row. (dream - dreamt - <b>dreamt</b> )
drunk	I have already <b>drunk</b> three glasses of orange. (drink - drank - <b>drunk</b> )
driven	I try to walk to work now, but I have still <b>driven</b> a couple of times this month. (drive - drove - <b>driven</b> )
eaten	So far today, I have <b>eaten</b> eggs and bacon. (eat - ate - <b>eaten</b> )
