

Spelling list: Irregular Verbs: Past Participle Form (k, l, and m words)

Irregular verbs in English, beginning with the letters k, l, and m. Learn the verbs in their past participle form in column one. See the verbs used in context in column two.

kept	I have kept it a secret for weeks already. (keep - kept - kept)
known	We have known about the test since last week. (know - knew - known)
laid	I have just laid the table for supper. (lay - laid - laid)
led	The teacher has already led the class through the maze. (lead - led - led)
learnt	We have just learnt about fractions in Maths. (learn - learnt - learnt)
left	We have already left the party. (leave - left - left)
lent	The library has just lent me a new book. (lend - lent - lent)
let	The teacher has already let the children have extra playtime. (let - let - let)
lain	Although she has only just lain down, she is already falling asleep. (lie - lay - lain)
lit	We have just lit the lamps. (light - lit - lit)
lost	Have you ever lost a toy? (lose - lost - lost)
made	We have already made sandwiches for lunch. (make - made - made)
meant	I have never meant anything more seriously. (mean - meant - meant)
met	We have just met our new teacher. (meet - met - met)
