Spelling list: The short /oo/ sound

Welcome to this list on the short /oo/sound!

In this list, you will explore words where the letters *oo* create a sound similar to that in *book* or *foot*. These words are used in everyday conversation - learning them will help you build your vocabulary and improve your pronunciation. Notice how the sound is crisp yet brief, making it distinct from the long */oo/* sound found in other words.

As you work through examples like *good*, *wood*, and *cook*, you will gain confidence in spelling this pattern. Try a *Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check* activity to support your learning.

good I could see from his smile that he was in a **good** mood.

wood Could you chop some **wood** for the fire?

cook We **cook** in the kitchen.

look He tried not to **look** into the bright light.

soot The fireplace was covered in **soot** .

foot I dipped my **foot** in the freezing water.

wool Her new sweater was made from **wool** .
