Set during World War One, the play revolves around the experiences of a British infantry company led by Captain Stanhope. As the soldiers face the imminent threat of an enemy attack, their relationships, fears, and resilience are tested.

Stanhope	Stanhope gains a Military Cross for bravery.
Osborne	Osborne is Stanhope's second in command.
Raleigh	Raleigh describes the war as 'silly'.
Trotter	Trotter is humorous, short and fat.
Hibbert	Hibbert doesn't really fit in with the other soldiers.
Colonel	The Colonel is more upper class than the other officers.
Hardy	Hardy is disorganised; a contrast to Stanhope.
Mason	Mason is Stanhope's servant.
