

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (compiled - conduct)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

compiled	If you have <b>compiled</b> something, it means you have put it together.
complement	If two things or people <b>complement</b> each other, it means they go well together.
complex	If something is <b>complex</b> , it means it is complicated.
comply	If you <b>comply</b> with something, it means you follow its rules.
component	A <b>component</b> is a part of something.
compose	If you <b>compose</b> a piece of music or a letter, it means you write it.
compound	A <b>compound</b> is a whole formed by a union of two or more elements or parts.
comprehensive	If something is <b>comprehensive</b> it includes all of the aspects of something.
comprise	<b>Comprise</b> means made up of.
compute	If you <b>compute</b> something, it means you calculate it.
computer	A <b>computer</b> is a machine that stores and processes data.
conceived	If something has been <b>conceived</b> , it means it has been thought of.
concentrate	If you <b>concentrate</b> on something, it means you direct all your attention to it.
concentration	<b>Concentration</b> is the process of giving something your complete attention.
concept	A <b>concept</b> is an abstract idea.
conclusion	A <b>conclusion</b> is the end of something or a summing up of an idea.
concurrent	If two things are <b>concurrent</b> , it means they are occurring at the same time.
conduct	If you <b>conduct</b> something, it means you manage or control it.
