

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (confer - constraints)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

confer	If you <b>confer</b> with someone, it means you discuss something with them.
conference	A <b>conference</b> is a prearranged meeting for consultation, exchange of information, or discussion.
confident	If you are <b>confident</b> , it means you are sure of yourself.
confined	If something is <b>confined</b> , it means it is not free to move about.
confirmed	If something has been <b>confirmed</b> , it means it has been made firm or established as true.
conflict	A <b>conflict</b> is an open clash between two opposing groups or individuals.
conformity	<b>Conformity</b> is acting in accordance with certain accepted standards.
consent	<b>Consent</b> means permission to do something.
consequences	<b>Consequences</b> are the results or outcomes of an event or action.
consequent	<b>Consequent</b> describes something that is following or a result of something else.
considerable	<b>Considerable</b> means large in number or amount.
consist	<b>Consist</b> means made up of.
consistent	If something is <b>consistent</b> , it means it behaves in the same way over time.
constant	If something is <b>constant</b> , it means it is unvarying in nature.
constitute	<b>Constitute</b> means made up of or composed from.
constitutional	If something is <b>constitutional</b> , it means it is operating under the political principles of a government.

constraints

The **constraints** on something are the things that are holding it back.
