

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (construct - convert)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

construct	If you <b>construct</b> something, it means you build it.
construction	<b>Construction</b> is the work related to building something.
consult	If you <b>consult</b> someone, it means you seek information or advice from them.
consultation	A <b>consultation</b> is a conference between two or more people to consider a particular question.
consume	If you <b>consume</b> something, it means you eat or use it.
consumer	A <b>consumer</b> is a person who uses goods or services.
contact	If you <b>contact</b> someone, it means you establish communication with them.
contemporary	If something is <b>contemporary</b> , it means it is characteristic of the present.
context	The word <b>context</b> is used to describe the circumstances that surround a situation or event.
contract	A <b>contract</b> is a binding agreement between two or more people that is enforceable by law.
contradiction	A <b>contradiction</b> is when two opposing ideas appear together.
contrary	<b>Contrary</b> means opposite in nature.
contrast	<b>Contrast</b> is when two things are compared to show their opposition or dissimilarity.
contribution	A <b>contribution</b> is the part played by a person in bringing about a result.
controversy	A <b>controversy</b> is dispute where there is strong disagreement.
convene	If you <b>convene</b> somewhere, it means you meet there.

convention	A <b>convention</b> is the way something is usually done or has traditionally been done.
conversely	<b>Conversely</b> is used to introduce an idea that is the reverse of the one before.
convert	If you <b>convert</b> something, you change it from one thing to another.
