

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (gender - hypothesis)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

gender	The word <b>gender</b> is used to describe a range of internal identities, some of which are expressed in terms of masculinity or femininity.
generate	If you <b>generate</b> something, it means you produce or make it.
generation	A <b>generation</b> is all of the people who were born and living around the same time.
gigantic	If something is <b>gigantic</b> , it means it is very large.
global	<b>Global</b> means involving the entire earth.
goal	A <b>goal</b> is an aim or target.
grade	A <b>grade</b> is a particular position or degree of value.
grant	If you <b>grant</b> something to someone, you agree to let them have it.
granted	If something is <b>granted</b> , it is agreed to or allowed.
guarantee	A <b>guarantee</b> is an unconditional commitment that something will happen or that something is true.
guidelines	<b>Guidelines</b> are rules or principles that provide guidance to appropriate behaviour.
hence	<b>Hence</b> is a word used to introduce a logical conclusion.
hierarchical	If something is <b>hierarchical</b> , it means its a system that ranks people or things based on a set criteria.
highlighted	If something has been <b>highlighted</b> , it means it has had special attention drawn to it.
