

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (objective - overseas)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

objective	An <b>objective</b> is a goal.
obsolete	If something is <b>obsolete</b> , it means it is no longer in use.
obtain	If you <b>obtain</b> something, it means you come into possession of it.
obvious	If something is <b>obvious</b> , it means it is easily seen or understood.
occupational	<b>Occupational</b> means related to the work you were trained to do.
occupy	If you <b>occupy</b> yourself with something, it means you keep yourself busy with it.
occur	<b>Occur</b> is another word for happen.
odd	If something is <b>odd</b> , it means it is unusual or unexpected.
offset	If you <b>offset</b> something, it means you make up for it somewhere else.
ongoing	If something is <b>ongoing</b> , it means it is currently happening.
option	An <b>option</b> is one of a number of things from which only one can be chosen.
orient	If you <b>orient</b> something, it means you determine its position in reference to another point.
orientation	<b>Orientation</b> is the the act of determining one thing's position in reference to another point.
outcome	An <b>outcome</b> is the result of something.
output	An <b>output</b> is signal that comes out of an electronic system.
overall	<b>Overall</b> means 'including everything'.
overlap	<b>Overlap</b> means to extend over or cover a part of something else.

overseas
