

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (identical - impose)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

identical	If two things are <b>identical</b> , it means they are exactly alike.
identify	If you <b>identify</b> someone, it means you establish who they are.
ideology	<b>Ideology</b> is an orientation that characterises the thinking of a group or nation.
ignorance	<b>Ignorance</b> is the lack of knowledge or education.
ignored	If something is <b>ignored</b> , it means it is disregarded.
illuminate	If you <b>illuminate</b> something, it means you make it lighter or brighter.
illustrate	If you <b>illustrate</b> something, it means you add artwork to it.
image	An <b>image</b> is a visual representation of something produced on a surface.
immense	If something is <b>immense</b> , it means it is unusually great in size, quality, or amount.
immigration	<b>Immigration</b> is the process of moving to and settling in a place you were not born in.
impact	The <b>impact</b> of something is its consequence.
implement	If you <b>implement</b> something, it means you apply it in a manner consistent with its purpose or design.
implementation	<b>Implementation</b> is the act of accomplishing some aim or executing some order.
implicate	If you <b>implicate</b> someone, it means you connect them to something in an incriminating way.  An <b>implication</b> is something that is understood without being explicitly

implication	stated.
implicit	If something is <b>implicit</b> , it means it has been implied but not directly expressed.
imply	If you <b>imply</b> something, it means you suggest it without directly expressing it.
impose	If you <b>impose</b> something on someone, it means you force it upon them.
