

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (impressive - inhibition)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

impressive	If something is <b>impressive</b> , it means it is grand or spectacular.
incentive	An <b>incentive</b> motivates you to do something.
incidence	<b>Incidence</b> is the frequency with which something occurs.
inclination	If you have an <b>inclination</b> towards something, it means you favour it over other things.
income	Your <b>income</b> is the money you make.
incompatible	If two things are <b>incompatible</b> , it means they do not work well together.
incorporated	If something has been <b>incorporated</b> , it means it has been combined into something else.
independent	If you are <b>independent</b> , it means you are free from external control and constraint.
index	An <b>index</b> is an alphabetical listing of names and topics along with the page numbers on which they are discussed.
indicate	If you <b>indicate</b> something, it means you signal it is there.
individual	If something is <b>individual</b> , it means it is separate and distinct from others of the same kind.
induced	If something is <b>induced</b> , it means it is brought about.
industrious	If someone is <b>industrious</b> , it means they are hardworking.
inevitably	If something happens <b>inevitably</b> , it means it happened in the only way it ever could have occurred.
inferred	If something is <b>inferred</b> , it means it is deduced or reasoned using logic.

infrastructure	<b>Infrastructure</b> is the basic structure or features of a system or organisation.
inherent	If something is <b>inherent</b> , it means it is permanent, essential, or characteristic.
inhibit	If you <b>inhibit</b> something, it means you limit or stop it.
inhibition	An <b>inhibition</b> is a feeling that makes you self conscious and stops you feeling relaxed.
