

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (intercept - items)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

intercept	If you <b>intercept</b> something, it means you seize it on its way to its intended destination.
intermediate	If something is <b>intermediate</b> , it means it falls in between two extremes.
internal	If something is <b>internal</b> , it means it occurs on the inside.
interpret	If you <b>interpret</b> something, it means you work out and explain its meaning.
interpretation	An <b>interpretation</b> is the act of explaining the meaning or results of something.
interval	An <b>interval</b> is a definite length of time marked off by two instants.
intervention	An <b>intervention</b> is the act of getting involved with something in order to alter or hinder it.
intrinsic	<b>Intrinsic</b> means belonging to a thing by its very nature.
invest	If you <b>invest</b> in something, it means you put time, money, or energy into it with the expectation of receiving a share of its success or profits.
investigate	If you <b>investigate</b> something, it means you make formal inquiries in order to discover the truth about it.
investigation	An <b>investigation</b> is a formal inquiry.
investment	An <b>investment</b> is the laying out of money or capital in an enterprise with the expectation of profit.
invoked	If something has been <b>invoked</b> , it means it has been summoned into action.
involve	If you <b>involve</b> someone in something, it means you engage them as a participant.

isolated	If you feel <b>isolated</b> , it means you feel cut off or left behind.
issue	An <b>issue</b> is an important question that is in dispute and must be settled.
items	<b>Items</b> are individual units or things that can be specified separately.
