

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (perish - preceding)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

perish	To <b>perish</b> means to die.
persistent	If someone is <b>persistent</b> , it means they are stubborn about their idea or opinion.
perspective	A <b>perspective</b> is a way of looking at a topic or situation.
phase	A <b>phase</b> is a distinct time period in a sequence of events.
phenomenon	A <b>phenomenon</b> is a state or process that is known through the senses rather than by intuition or reasoning.
philosophy	<b>Philosophy</b> is the rational investigation of questions about existence, knowledge, and ethics.
physical	If something is <b>physical</b> , it means it relates to the body rather the mind or the spirit.
plus	<b>Plus</b> is used to describe something on the positive side or higher end of a scale.
policy	A <b>policy</b> is a plan of action adopted by an individual or organisation.
portable	If something is <b>portable</b> it is easy and convenient to transport.
portion	A <b>portion</b> is a part of a whole.
posed	If something is <b>posed</b> , it means it has been arranged in a particular way so that it can be photographed.
positive	If something is described as <b>positive</b> , it means it is characterised by acceptance, certainty, and goodness.
potential	Your <b>potential</b> is your ability or capacity to do something.

practitioner      A **practitioner** is someone who practices a learned profession.

preceding      **Preceding** describes something that existed or came before.
