## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (precise - procedure)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

precise	If something is <b>precise</b> , it means it is exact or accurate.
predict	If you <b>predict</b> something, it means you guess it will happen in advance.
predominantly	Predominantly is another word for mainly.
prejudice	<b>Prejudice</b> is an unfounded opinion or bias that prevents objective consideration of an issue or situation.
preliminary	<b>Preliminary</b> is used to describe an action or event that comes before something more important.
preserve	If you preserve something, it means you prevent it from getting ruined.
presume	If you <b>presume</b> something, it means you accept it as true without any proof.
presumption	A <b>presumption</b> is an acceptance that something is true without proof.
previous	<b>Previous</b> is used to describe something that occurred just before something else in time or order.
primary	If something is described as <b>primary</b> , it means it is first in rank, importance, or value.
prime	If something is <b>prime</b> , it is of the best quality.
principal	A principal is someone in the lead role at a school or in a show.
principle	A principle is a rule or standard for good behaviour.
prior	Prior means earlier in time.
priority	A <b>priority</b> is something that is urgent or important and must be considered above all else.
procedure	A <b>procedure</b> is a particular course of action intended to achieve a result.
