rehabilitation	<b>Rehabilitation</b> is the process of helping someone adjust to life after prison.
workhouse	The <b>workhouse</b> was where the destitute were sent to work off debts.

vagrancy	<b>Vagrancy</b> was the crime of travelling around and begging.
vagabondage	<b>Vagabondage</b> is another word for vagrancy.
moral	A <b>moral</b> crime goes against the <b>moral</b> standards set by a society.
social	A <b>social</b> crime is something that most people do not consider to be wrong but which is still against the law.
hue	<b>Hue</b> and cry refers to how people raised the alarm after a crime by shouting and crying.
cry	Hue and <b>cry</b> refers to how people raised the alarm after a crime by shouting and crying.
