Key words for GCSE Maths

decrease	If you decrease a number, you make it smaller.
decimal	A decimal is a number that shows tenths and hundredths.
calculate	If you calculate , it means you are doing a mathematical operation.
figures	Numbers are also known as figures .
negative	A negative number is a number that is less than zero.
value	Value is how much something is worth.
recurring	Recurring means repeating.
remainder	A remainder is what's left over after dividing.
exchange	To exchange is to swap one quantity for another depending on value.
quotient	A quotient is a result calculated through division.
decomposition	Decomposition is a way of breaking down numbers in subtraction and a way of writing numbers as a product of their primes.
mental	If you carry out a sum without a calculator, it's called a mental calculation.
factor	A factor is a number that divides into another number exactly.
multiple	Multiples are the values that are a particular number's times table, for example 25 is a multiple of 5.
equivalent	If two numbers are equivalent , they have the same value.
fraction	A fraction is a part of a whole number, expressed as a/b. For example, a half is 1/2.
order	The order is the sequence in which you carry something out.
