Key words for GCSE Maths

capacity	A container's <b>capacity</b> is how much it can hold.
base	The bottom of a shape is its <b>base</b> .
intersect	If two lines <b>intersect</b> , it means they cross over.
mass	<b>Mass</b> refers to the quantity of something.
time	<b>Time</b> measures the distance between events, for example in months or hours.
point	A <b>point</b> is a coordinate on a graph, or a specific spot on a diagram.
centre	The middle point of something is called the <b>centre</b> .
cube	A <b>cube</b> is a 3D shape with six equal-sized faces.
trigonometry	<b>Trigonometry</b> looks at the sides and angles of triangles.
Pythagoras	<b>Pythagoras</b> is known for his work on the sides and angles of triangles.
arc	A section of the circumference of a circle is called an <b>arc</b> .
asymmetrical	<b>Asymmetrical</b> means not symmetrical.
bearing	A <b>bearing</b> is a measurement of a turn calculated in degrees.
bisect	If you <b>bisect</b> a line, it means you cut it in half.
chord	A straight line that joins two points on a circumference is a <b>chord</b> .
circumference	The <b>circumference</b> of a circle is the distance around it.
