contraception	<b>Contraception</b> is used to prevent pregnancy.

homophobia	<b>Homophobia</b> is prejudice against gay people.
homosexual	If you are <b>homosexual</b> , it means you are attracted to people who are the same sex as you.
holy	A <b>holy</b> war is a war that is believed to be for religious purpose.
war	A holy <b>war</b> is a <b>war</b> that is believed to be for religious purpose.
justice	<b>Justice</b> is fairness and equality in the way that people are treated.
morality	<b>Morality</b> refers to the rules of what is right and wrong within a society.
