Key words for GCSE English Literature.

focus	The <b>focus</b> of a text is its main purpose or interest.
sentence	<b>Sentence</b> structure is the order of elements in a <b>sentence</b> .
structure	Sentence <b>structure</b> is the order of elements in a sentence.
form	Sentence <b>form</b> refers to the specific function of a sentence.
point	A <b>point</b> of view is someone's perspective.
view	A point of <b>view</b> is someone's perspective.
context	The <b>context</b> is the setting and circumstance of an event.
fragmented	<b>Fragmented</b> means broken or split into different parts.
pace	<b>Pace</b> is the speed at which a story is told.
footnote	A <b>footnote</b> appears at the bottom of a text to add information.
suspense	<b>Suspense</b> is the building of tension in a plot.
overview	An <b>overview</b> is a summary.
surprise	A <b>surprise</b> is an unexpected event.
tragedy	A <b>tragedy</b> is a devastating event.
viewpoint	A <b>viewpoint</b> is someone's perspective on something.
opening	The <b>opening</b> is the beginning of a narrative.
setting	The <b>setting</b> is where the events in a novel or play are taking place.
character	A <b>character</b> is a fictional person or being in a story.
dialogue	<b>Dialogue</b> is a conversational exchange.
