language	<b>Language</b> is how human's communicate.
structure	<b>Structure</b> refers to how a text is put together.
summarise	To <b>summarise</b> is to present the most important facts in a clear way.
synthesise	If you <b>synthesise</b> something, it means you bring together what you've learned to draw conclusions.
compare	To <b>compare</b> is to examine the similarities and differences between things.
writer	A <b>writer</b> is someone whose job is writing books, stories, or articles.
dialogue	<b>Dialogue</b> is a conversational exchange.
setting	<b>Setting</b> refers to the place or conditions in which something happens.
phrase	A <b>phrase</b> is a group of words that does not form a sentence.
word	<b>Word</b> level is when we focus on the words in a text.

vocabulary	<b>Vocabulary</b> is the body of words used.
terminology	<b>Terminology</b> is a system of words used to name things in a particular discipline.

slang	<b>Slang</b> is informal language.
direct	<b>Direct</b> address is when the writer or actor directly communicates with the reader or audience.

address	Direct <b>address</b> is when the writer or actor directly communicates with the reader or audience.
fiction	<b>Fiction</b> is a form of literature that describes imaginary events.
