Key words for GCSE English Language.

implies	If a text <b>implies</b> something, it suggests it without outright saying it.
context	The <b>context</b> is the setting and circumstance of an event.
method	A <b>method</b> is a specific way of doing something.
narrative	A written or spoken story is a <b>narrative</b> .
effective	If something is <b>effective</b> , it means it is successful at producing its intended result.
identify	If you <b>identify</b> something, it means you establish what it is.
judicious	To be <b>judicious</b> is to show good sense and judgment.
reference	If you <b>reference</b> something, it means you mention it.
quotation	A <b>quotation</b> is the direct use of a word, phrase, or sentence from another source.
explain	If you <b>explain</b> something, it means you give reasons as to why it happens.
comment	A <b>comment</b> is a brief written or spoken remark about something.
influence	<b>Influence</b> is the power to affect and change someone or something.
range	A <b>range</b> is a variety of things from the same general group.
convey	If you <b>convey</b> something, it means you communicate it..
pathetic	<b>Pathetic</b> fallacy is when a writer gives human feelings to something non-human in order to create an effect.
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symbolism	<b>Symbolism</b> is when a word, phrase, or image stands for an idea or theme.
foreshadow	To <b>foreshadow</b> is to give a clues or hints about a future event.
pun	A <b>pun</b> is a humorous play on words that suggests multiple meanings behind an idea.
