Key words for GCSE English Language.

elaboration	<b>Elaboration</b> is the act of adding more detail to a statement or idea.
conclusion	A <b>conclusion</b> is a decision reached by reasoning.
discourse	<b>Discourse</b> is the formal discussion of a topic.
etiquette	<b>Etiquette</b> is the observance of formal or expected requirements.
explicit	If something is <b>explicit</b> , it means it is stated in an obvious way.
position	Something's <b>position</b> is where it is located.
consensus	A <b>consensus</b> is a view agreed on by a group.
contradiction	A <b>contradiction</b> is a statement which opposes one that had already been made.
persuasion	<b>Persuasion</b> is the act of convincing someone through reasoning.
synthesis	<b>Synthesis</b> is when you bring together what you've learned to draw conclusions.
summary	A <b>summary</b> is a presentation of the key points.
exaggerate	To <b>exaggerate</b> is to magnify something beyond its reality.
rhetoric	<b>Rhetoric</b> is the art of writing or speaking in a persuasive way.
