Key words for GCSE English Language.

declarative sentence	A <b>declarative</b> sentence is a statement of fact.
imperative	An <b>imperative</b> sentence gives an order or command.
interrogative	An <b>interrogative</b> sentence asks a direct question.
objective tone	<b>Objective</b> tone is impartial and is not influenced by personal opinions.
eyewitness account	An <b>eyewitness</b> account is a report of events from someone who witnessed them.
narrative	<b>Narrative</b> is another word for story.
linear	A <b>linear</b> narrative presents the plot in chronological order.
cyclical	A <b>cyclical</b> narrative ends in the same place it began.
foreshadow	To <b>foreshadow</b> is to give a clues or hints about a future event.
explicit	If something is <b>explicit</b> , it means it is stated in an obvious way.
implicit	If something is <b>implicit</b> , it means it has been implied but not directly expressed.
deduce	If you <b>deduce</b> something, it means you work it out through reasoning.
statement	A <b>statement</b> is a clear expression in speech or writing.
