

## Spelling list: Entry Level 3: Words ending in *-ant*

Words that learners at Entry Level 3 are required to read and spell correctly.

In these words the weak vowel sound in the final syllable is spelled with the letter *a* . There are many words ending in *-ant* . Here are just a few.

abundant	The field was <b>abundant</b> with wildlife.
brilliant	I have a <b>brilliant</b> driving instructor.
constant	The trophy is a <b>constant</b> reminder of his success.
distant	We went to see a <b>distant</b> relation who lives in Scotland.
dominant	The company were <b>dominant</b> in the marketplace.
elegant	She wore an <b>elegant</b> dress.
extravagant	The palace was full of <b>extravagant</b> decoration.
fragrant	The air was <b>fragrant</b> with the smell of jasmine.
hesitant	John was <b>hesitant</b> to stand up and speak.
ignorant	His behaviour proved how <b>ignorant</b> he was.
important	It is <b>important</b> to challenge ourselves in lessons.
observant	The security guard was very <b>observant</b> .
pleasant	The weather was <b>pleasant</b> today.
redundant	The question was <b>redundant</b> because the answer was already clear.
relevant	She listed her <b>relevant</b> experience on the job application.
reluctant	He was <b>reluctant</b> to answer my question.
significant	There was a <b>significant</b> increase in vinyl sales this year.
tolerant	The daycare owner was very <b>tolerant</b> .

triumphant      The winning team were **triumphant** .

vacant      There is one **vacant** room in the hotel.
