

## Spelling list: Entry Level 2: Words with doubled letters

Words that learners at Entry Level 2 are required to read and spell correctly.

These words are examples of the doubling rule: when a word ends in a short vowel and one consonant we must double the consonant when adding a vowel suffix.

flapping	The bird was <b>flapping</b> its wings.
getting	My spelling is <b>getting</b> much better.
runner	The <b>runner</b> showed great endurance.
spotted	We <b>spotted</b> a kingfisher on the river bank.
jogger	The <b>jogger</b> runs five miles a day.
funny	Bob's wedding speech was very <b>funny</b> .
snappy	He was very <b>snappy</b> when he was hungry.
setting	The house is in a tranquil riverside <b>setting</b> .
hidden	I have <b>hidden</b> my sweets from my brother.
trodden	I think you have <b>trodden</b> in something smelly.
dipped	I <b>dipped</b> my foot in the freezing water.
