## Spelling list: Words with doubled letters (SHAMS)

These words are examples of the doubling rule: when a word ends in a short vowel and one consonant we must double the consonant when adding a vowel suffix.

flapping	The bird was <b>flapping</b> its wings.
getting	He hated getting up in the morning.
runner	The <b>runner</b> went really fast in the race.
spotted	Last year, we <b>spotted</b> our first snowflake on Christmas Eve.
jogger	The <b>jogger</b> runs five miles a day.
funny	The clown was so funny!
snappy	He has a very <b>snappy</b> way of talking.
setting	The <b>setting</b> is where the events in a novel or play are taking place.
hidden	I have hidden my sweets from my brother.
trodden	I think you have trodden in something smelly.
dipped	He <b>dipped</b> the paintbrush into the paint.
