Spelling list: Words with doubled letters (SHAMS)

These words are examples of the doubling rule: when a word ends in a short vowel and one consonant we must double the consonant when adding a vowel suffix.

flapping The bird was **flapping** its wings.

getting He hated **getting** up in the morning.

runner The **runner** went really fast in the race.

spotted Last year, we **spotted** our first snowflake on Christmas Eve.

jogger The **jogger** runs five miles a day.

funny The clown was so funny!

snappy He has a very **snappy** way of talking.

setting The **setting** is where the events in a novel or play are taking place.

hidden I have **hidden** my sweets from my brother.

trodden I think you have **trodden** in something smelly.

dipped He **dipped** the paintbrush into the paint.
