| pitch    | Her singing was slightly off <b>pitch</b> .                    |
| hatch    | We saw some ducklings <b>hatch</b> .                           |
| pinch    | That <b>pinch</b> made me say ouch!                            |
| dutch    | His grandfather was Dutch.                                     |
| wrench   | I had to quickly <b>wrench</b> the man out of the burning car. |
| teach    | Mum will <b>teach</b> me how to drive.                         |
| catch    | Many people <b>catch</b> flu each winter.                      |
| hutch    | Take the rabbit out of its <b>hutch</b> .                      |
| bench    | They sat together on the park <b>bench</b> .                   |
| rich     | The heir to his fortune will be very <b>rich</b> .             |
| birch    | The <b>birch</b> tree was dying slowly.                        |
| fetch    | I will <b>fetch</b> the water.                                 |
