### English Keywords 1

comparative	A <b>comparative</b> creates a better picture of something by judging how similar or different it is to something else.
imperative	The <b>imperative</b> is a command or order.
superlative	<b>Superlative</b> is saying something is the best, worst, most or least, for example.
homonym	A <b>homonym</b> is a word that sounds the same but can be spelled differently and has a different meaning.
antonym	An <b>antonym</b> is a word with the opposite meaning to another.
synonym	A <b>synonym</b> is a word with the same or similar meaning to another word.
acronym	An <b>acronym</b> is a word made form the first letters of a group of other words ; scuba, for example.
conjunction	A word which joins other words together is called a <b>conjunction</b> .
noun	A <b>noun</b> is a word that names someone or something.
adjective	An <b>adjective</b> is a word which describes something.
verb	A <b>verb</b> is a word that names an action ; run, walk, talk, for example.
adverb	An <b>adverb</b> is a word that describes a verb or an action.
tense	The <b>tense</b> describes when something took place.
rhetorical	A <b>rhetorical</b> device, such as a question, is used for effect rather than to get an answer.
question	He was reluctant to answer my <b>question</b> .
exclamation	An <b>exclamation</b> mark is used to show strong feeling or when telling

someone what to do.

## Mark

An exclamation **mark** is used to show strong feeling or when telling someone what to do.
