

## Spelling list: -tch words

-tch rule - after a short vowel - use this spelling if "ch" sound comes after a short vowel

match	Let me see the football <b>match</b> please.
fetch	Robert threw the ball and his dog ran to <b>fetch</b> it.
stitch	I need to <b>stitch</b> up my torn coat.
blotch	The ink left a <b>blotch</b> mark on his book.
catch	Many people <b>catch</b> flu each winter.
stretch	<b>Stretch</b> to warm up before you run.
switch	Close the curtains then <b>switch</b> on the light.
notch	Another <b>notch</b> on his belt.
butcher	My mum buys her steak from the <b>butcher</b> .
kitchen	We cook in the <b>kitchen</b> .
ketchup	John likes <b>ketchup</b> on his food.
hutch	Take the rabbit out of its <b>hutch</b> .
