

## Spelling list: a-e words - set 2

amaze	You never fail to <b>amaze</b> me.
debate	Politicians <b>debate</b> important issues in parliament.
escape	The zebra tried to <b>escape</b> from the zoo.
inflate	How quickly can you <b>inflate</b> all the balloons?
translate	Can you <b>translate</b> from French?
migrate	Some birds <b>migrate</b> at the same time each year.
vibrate	The heavy truck made the bridge <b>vibrate</b> .
behave	My dog is being trained to <b>behave</b> well.
inhale	<b>Inhale</b> means to breathe in.
exhale	<b>Exhale</b> means to breathe out.
aeroplane	The Wright brothers flew the first <b>aeroplane</b> .
calculate	Can you <b>calculate</b> the total cost?
emigrate	Tom plans to <b>emigrate</b> to Mexico when he retires.
estimate	I <b>estimate</b> we'll land in forty minutes.
hesitate	Please don't <b>hesitate</b> to call me.
