Spelling list: ique words

In English, the *ique* ending is pronounced with a distinctive /eek/ sound. These words are commonly borrowed from French and often describe objects, qualities, or people.

Here are two examples:

antique - That mahogany cupboard is an antique.

technique - We all admired the wood-carver's technique.

Understanding the *ique* pattern can help you spell and use these unique words.
