Repetition	Repetition of the same word(s) at the beginning of a series of phrases or lines.
Simile	A simile is a figurative expression which uses the words 'like' or 'as' to compare one object or idea with another to suggest that they are alike. Example: She is as busy as a bee.
Metaphor	A metaphor is saying something is something else.
Onomatopoeia	Onomatopoeia is when it sounds like the word, for example bang.
Adjective	The colour adjectives 'golden' and 'green' make the reader feel that the riverbank is full of warmth and life.
Favourite	The girls went to see their favourite pop group.
Idyllic	Steinbeck creates an idyllic atmosphere at the beginning of Of Mice and Men.
