Use the following words when analysing and describing artworks.

subjective	To be <b>subjective</b> is to give an opinion based on personal feelings.
cultural	Signs codes or symbols that can link to a culture and creates <b>cultural</b> meaning within the artwork.
postmodern	<b>Postmodern</b> is an art movement that was influenced by technology, humour and irony. Appropriation was also closely linked to it.
structural	To explore the <b>structural</b> elements of an artwork is to look at how it was made and what materials were used..
abstract	<b>Abstract</b> art is a representation of something in a unrealistic way. It often makes no clear link to the true subject and is an interpretation of the artist.
realism	<b>Realism</b> is an art style which uses the every day and commonplace as its subject.
bold	Click B to change the text to <b>bold</b> .
colourful	A pheasant is a large <b>colourful</b> bird.
contrasting	Oxymoron is where two words of <b>contrasting</b> meaning are adjacent to each other.
delicate	Mosses have weak roots ; thin, <b>delicate</b> leaves and do not have seeds.
flowing	<b>Flowing</b> can be used when describing lines within an artwork.
layered	<b>Layered</b> images, shapes, lines, paint by the artist.
parallel	<b>Parallel</b> lines are always the same distance apart.
movement	The sensor detected a <b>movement</b> .
form	An acronym is a word made <b>form</b> the first letters of a group of other words ; scuba, for example.

blend	To <b>blend</b> is to mix together.
composition	The crowd gathered in the hall to hear the young musicians play their exciting new <b>composition</b> .
subject	Exams test your comprehension of a <b>subject</b> .
graphic	A stylised black and white image is often called <b>graphic</b> .
