

## Spelling list: Longer words with *ck*

In this section, we delve into words that include the *ck* spelling. This spelling represents the hard /k/ sound that follows a short vowel. Understanding this spelling rule is essential for clear communication in your writing.

Notable examples are: *packet* , *ticket* , and *rocket* .

ticket	Have you got a <b>ticket</b> for the show?
cricket	There are eleven players in a <b>cricket</b> team.
locket	A <b>locket</b> is a necklace that holds a picture.
rocket	The <b>rocket</b> shot up in the sky.
socket	I plug my phone into the <b>socket</b> to charge.
bucket	We use a <b>bucket</b> for mixing our cement.
padlock	My shed will be safe with this <b>padlock</b> on the door.
sundeck	They lay on the <b>sundeck</b> of the boat.
