Spelling list: igh words

The *igh* spelling pattern is used to represent long /*i*/ sound in English. You will find this pattern in words like *high*, *sigh*, and *night*. The *igh* combination is commonly used in the middle or at the end of a word.

When spelling words with the *igh* pattern, remember that the three-letter combination replaces the single letter *i*. This helps differentiate between similar-sounding words, such as *right* and *write*. Pay attention to the *gh* because these letters are part of the spelling pattern even though they don't contribute to the sound.
