

Spelling list: y in the middle (British)

The letter *y* in the middle of a word often represents the long vowel sound /i/, as seen in words like *rhyme* , *style* , and *cycle* . It is commonly used in words that have a Greek or Latin origin.

Other examples of *y* to spell the long /i/ sound include *psychology* , *dynamic* , and *hydrogen* .

rhyme	These words all rhyme: time, crime, chime.
style	The victorious team celebrated in style .
type	A fern is a type of plant.
cycle	We all cycle to work.
dynamic	Beth has a very dynamic personality.
hyena	The hyena feeds on dead animals.
hyphen	Do you know how to use a hyphen correctly?
hydrogen	Hydrogen is a highly inflammable gas.
pylon	The wire was strung to a pylon .
python	A python kills its prey by crushing it.
typhoon	Two ships were sunk in the typhoon .
tyrant	The powerful leader was a tyrant .
paralyse	In the worst of cases, the poison can paralyse your body.
hygiene	We were taught all about the importance of hygiene when cooking.
psychology	My brother is studying psychology at college.
psychiatry	Psychiatry is the study and treatment of mental illness.
analyse	Can you analyse these results for me?
