*Lord of the Flies* by William Golding is an allegorical novel that depicts the descent into savagery by a group of schoolboys stranded on a deserted island. Sam	<b>Sam</b> and Eric are a pair of twins closely allied with Ralph.
Eric	Sam and <b>Eric</b> are a pair of twins closely allied with Ralph.
Samneric	Sam and Eric are inseparable twins who are known by the group as <b>Samneric</b> .
Maurice	<b>Maurice</b> is one of the older boys who initially follows the rules but later gives in to primal impulses.
Percival	<b>Percival</b> , one of the younger boys, experiences increasing fear and anxiety as the story progresses.
Henry	<b>Henry</b> represents innocence and is often absorbed in his own world of sandcastles and play.
Littluns	The <b>littluns</b> are a group of younger boys who often display fear and vulnerability.
