Spelling list: y in the middle (US)

The letter *y* in the middle of a word often represents the long /i/ sound, as in *rhyme*, *style*, and *cycle*. It can also appear in words with Greek or Latin roots, such as *psychology* and *hygiene*.

Notice how in *psychology*, the *y* in the middle makes a long /i/ sound, while the *y* at the end makes a short /i/ sound.

Why not try a *spelling test* to check your understanding of these words?

rhyme These words all rhyme: time, crime, chime.

style I'm going to alter my hair **style**.

type Many types of fish live in coral.

cycle I prefer to **cycle** to work rather than going by bus.

dynamic Beth has a very **dynamic** personality.

hyena The **hyena** feeds on dead animals.

hyphen A **hyphen** can be used to join two words: good-looking.

hydrogen Water is two parts **hydrogen** and one part oxygen.

pylon The wires are strung along very tall pylons.

python A **python** kills its prey by crushing it.

typhoon Two ships were sunk in the **typhoon**.

tyrant The powerful leader was a **tyrant** .

analyze Please **analyze** these figures for me.

paralyze He is paralyzed from the waist down.

hygiene Good **hygiene** keeps germs away.

psychology My brother is studying **psychology** at college.
