

## Spelling list: *ind* words

Words with *ind* use the letter *i* to represent the long /i/ sound, as in *find* and *kind* . These words often have simple, consistent spelling patterns, making them easier to learn.

For example, in *bind* , the long /i/ sound is followed by *nd* , while in *mind* , the same pattern applies.

Learn these words by playing a fun spelling game to help you remember them!

bind	Rope was used to <b>bind</b> the prisoners.
blind	The baby was born <b>blind</b> and deaf.
find	Fred can never <b>find</b> his car keys.
grind	We <b>grind</b> our spices in a pestle and mortar.
hind	The dog stood up on his <b>hind</b> legs.
kind	What <b>kind</b> of pizza would you like?
mind	I might change my <b>mind</b> .
rind	I grated some lemon <b>rind</b> to mix in the cake.
wind	I <b>wind</b> the rope around the post.
